## Regular Meeting – February 6, 2018

- CALL TO ORDER: The Regular Meeting of the Weaverville Fire Protection District was called to order by Chairman, Larry Helsley at 0959 hours. - a. Hazardous Reduction Progress Report: Chief Corbett reported that Title III funding is no longer available. He is looking into a possible Cal Fire grant.
- b. Fire Chief's Report: Chief Corbett reported that the County has possession of the Opticom warning signs. They will be reinstalled in June, at same time as lights at the 4-way intersection. They are hoping to get reimbursement from the person who hit the poll. The Cedar House final inspection was done. HRN occupancy complete. The Fire Chief's Association is still looking at the new Marijuana Ordinance and Chief Corbett has requested to be on the ad hoc committee due to the volatile chemicals and safety portions. He did a sprinkler final flow on Oregon St. He and Captain Alvord travelled to Willits and Redding to look at Water Tenders, he felt like Ferrara was better built equipment. The BAUER compressor was brought to up to OSHA compliance.
- c. Fire Department Report: There are 27 members, we ran 50 calls to date. Cal Fire winter training has begun starting with a HazMat refresher. We will host a S-290 class at WFD. Our Appreciation Dinner is on Feb 17. The Valentine's Day Rose Sale is on the 10<sup>th</sup>. The Explorer program is going strong with paperwork completed to become a Scout Post. Some of the members have applied for the academy in Tracy, CA.
- d. Sleeper Program Report: Chief Corbett reported that the gates, at Station 2, are locked. If some needs in there is a key at Station #2. It was suggested that we might want to hang a sign on the building that says, "Call 9-1-1 for emergencies.
